Third party reporting guide updated for OpSnap



Our guide to third party reporting of video footage of motoring offences is one of the most popular pages on our website. We've now updated it to include guidance on the new OpSnap portal run by Gloucestershire Police that should simplify submissions.

We are engaging with the police about some inconsistencies on the form around collision reporting and third party details consent, and are also eager to hear from local cycle users on how reports are being handled.

Reminder about upcoming A435 closure





For those cycling longer distances south from Cheltenham, or using connecting roads in south Cheltenham, remember that the total closure of the A435 up Charlton Hill is due to commence on 20 March. We would advise anyone concerned about this to contact the county council, copying in the campaign, so issues can be raised. There's also a public drop in event on 2 March organised by GCC to meet the contractors and project team.
